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

Operational History

The property was used as a Nike missile launch site from 1955 through 1963, when it was decommissioned. The property is located in a mixed commercial and residential area of Wayne.

Approximately half of the site, owned by Passaic County, is forested land in need of redevelopment, with a City of Newark utility easement bisecting it from north to south. The western half of the property is developed with buildings housing the Passaic County Mosquito Control Division, Weight and Measures Office, Meals-on-Wheels, and other county entities, as well as asphalt-paved parking areas for Passaic County Para-Transit jitneys and other vehicles. The Packanack Golf Course borders the site on its northern, eastern, and southern sides, while residential properties border the site to the northwest. The entrance to the site is marked by a steel gate, barbed-wire topped chain-link fence, and abandoned security guard shack - remnants of its military past.

Current Status

A pre-qualified consultant has completed a Phase I and Wetland delineation for the Site.
